Returned Checks: Trial Secretary will add a \$25.00 service charge for any returned check. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitor may result in being placed on a CASH ONLY basis.

Illegible Entries: Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks DO NOT constitute a valid entry.

All checks received will be deposited and **must clear to be considered a valid entry.**

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs SIX (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered to compete.

Condition of the Dog. Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind, may participate so long as the handler always has control of the dog, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

Important Information

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog. Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of a refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds. Please help keep the show site as well as your hotel clean so that we can use them in the future.

Staging Area, Judges Briefing, and Warm-Up Information

Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table for check-ins and posting of running order and results.

Handler/Judges Briefing will take place in view of the search area prior to the start of each class, after the hide(s) have been set and after the Demo Dog has run. In the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there is an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search. **NO DOGS** are to be present during the Handler's Briefing.

Warm-Up Area will be available. One labeled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Exhibitors should limit their warm-up to (2) two minutes or less. The warm-up area is not for training or relieving of the dog.

Search Area and Ring Conditions

Search Areas may be indoors, on various surfaces or outdoors on grass, gravel, earth, concrete, or asphalt.

Search Areas may be of any shape, and of the size specified in the AKC Regulations for each class.

Additional Site Information

Trial Site: It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

Possession of Odors and Training: Chapter 5, Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations states “No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area”.

Spectator Area: Spectating may be limited at this trial due to the COVID restrictions. If it is allowed, any person not handling a dog in the current class, or any person who has already completed their run in the class may choose to watch the search from the spectator area. Handlers may not watch other exhibitors from their class prior to their run except in the case of the Handler Discrimination class. No one outside the search area may assist the handler or disclose the location of the hide. Spectators who intentionally or unintentionally give aid to a team may be asked to leave the area by the judge. Spectators are forbidden to discuss details of the search with handlers who have not run.

Crating: There will be crating available in the Presidents Hall. Crates may be left overnight; however, the **Peninsula Dog Fanciers Club** nor the **Kitsap County Fairgrounds** will be responsible for any lost or damaged items. Dogs may not be left overnight. The crating area will be heated. Please use only specified potty areas. Exhibitors should avoid any outside area that is marked off as a search area.

Ribbons, Awards, and Prizes

All prizes and ribbons must be claimed the day of the show.

We will not be mailing or distributing after the trial.

Placements will be awarded in each class as follows:

First Place: Blue Rosette, Bucket, Toy, Treats, and Leash

Second Place: Red Rosette, Bucket, Toy and Treats

Third Place: Yellow Rosette, Bucket, Toy and Treats

Fourth Place: White Rosette, Bucket, Toy and Treats

Qualifiers will receive a Flat Green Qualifying Ribbon

New Element Title:

A Rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a “New Element” or “Level Title”.

High in Trial:

Exhibitor who is High in Trial, will receive a large Rosette, Dog Toy, Bucket, and a beautiful, handcrafted knife donated by Bill and Geri Mason (Frontier Stables, Silverdale).

Only teams who participate in the **same difficulty level** in **all elements** offered (Container, Interior, Exterior, and Buried) and **qualify** in each are eligible to win **High in Trial**. One High in Trial winner is chosen per difficulty level; there is no separate High in Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections.

Notice to Exhibitors

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY:

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all searches safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Peninsula Dog Fanciers Club and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Peninsula Dog Fanciers Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Peninsula Dog Fanciers Club or any official thereof.

Dogs found in an unsafe environment, distress, or harm's way such as in a hot motor vehicle will be removed to safety by Club officials or Security personnel. All persons attending this event waive any claim for damages against the Club, their members, or agents, in the event a motor vehicle must be entered to rescue a dog.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material.

All dogs must be on leash, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge, only if the area is completely enclosed.

Covid-19: We will be following the Washington State Covid-19 protocols, that are in place at the time of the trial.

Fire Lanes and designated areas must be kept clear.

REFUNDS:

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee. **Dogs pulled after closing** because of injury or other medical condition are not eligible for a refund.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. Refunds will be mailed after completion of the trial.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

RINGSIDE:

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system, stewards, or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

EXHIBITOR CHECK-IN: At check-in you will receive your armband number. Once the time and location for check-in is determined all exhibitors will be notified by email.

Claims will be arbitrated as set forth on the Official AKC Entry Form for this event.

In consideration of the acceptance of this entry, I (we) agree to abide by the rules and regulations of The American Kennel Club in effect at the time of this event, and any additional rules and regulations appearing in the premium list of this event and entry form and any decision made in accord with them. I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. I (we) certify and represent that the dog entered is not a hazard to persons or other dogs. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prizes, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event-giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents, superintendents or event secretary and the owner and/or lessor of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim of loss, injury or damage to this dog.

Job Descriptions:

Steward	Hot Box	Job is to reposition or wipe saliva off the Hot Box
	Cold Box	Job is to reposition or wipe saliva off the Cold Box
Timer		The timer is the individual who starts and stops the timing device and tells the search time to the judge.
Head Gate Steward		Monitors the run order and ensures that individuals are heading to the search areas when their time approaches.
Gate Steward		Monitors the flow of competitors into the search area. They ensure that competitors are in the proper running order.
Runner		The Runner collects the score sheets from the different classes and brings them to the Trial Secretary.
